



David Ismay is a Senior Attorney for CLF Massachusetts specializing in Clean Energy and Climate Change policy, law, and regulation. David regularly represents CLF in proceedings before the Massachusetts Energy Facility Siting Board and Department of Public Utilities and the state's Supreme Judicial Court. David was lead attorney for CLF in its successful *ENGIE Gas & LNG LLC v. Department of Public Utilities*, 56 N.E.3d 740 (Mass. 2016) appeal of DPU Order 15-37 authorizing the financing of interstate gas pipelines by electricity ratepayers.

Before joining CLF, David was a senior associate at Farella Braun + Martel LLP in San Francisco, where he practiced infrastructure, renewable energy and land-use law. His commercial practice was centered on drafting, negotiating and litigating commercial contracts for public and private entities with focus on major capital construction of buildings, infrastructure, and renewable/alternative energy power plants; he also has significant experience prosecuting and defending local land use approvals and related environmental review. Before law school, David served both as a Surface Warfare and as Special Warfare officer in the U.S. Navy.

David holds a B.S. in History with Honors from the United States Naval Academy, an M.A. in Philosophy, Politics and Economics from Oxford University (Queen's College) where he was a Rhodes Scholar, and a J.D. from Berkeley Law School (Boalt Hall). David served as a law clerk to the Hon. James R.
