Stephen Senderowitz concentrates his practice in securities, commodities, and derivatives litigation, complex civil litigation, corporate internal investigations, and white-collar criminal litigation.

Mr. Senderowitz has handled several hundred financial markets matters throughout the country, including numerous trials, arbitrations, hearings, and appeals involving regulatory and exchange actions, private securities and commodities fraud cases, class and shareholder derivative actions, and criminal matters.

He has represented a major national securities exchange, hedge funds, broker-dealers, futures commission merchants, traders, and other registrants, customers, an electronic communications network, as well as corporations, banks, lawyers, and accountants. He also has supervised corporate internal investigations involving insider trading, fraud, and Exchange corporate governance. He has been named an Illinois "Super Lawyer" in securities litigation by *Chicago Magazine*, and provided expert testimony in securities cases.

Prior to joining Winston & Strawn, Mr. Senderowitz was a partner and co-chair of the litigation department at another Chicago law firm. He previously served as an Assistant U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Illinois for eight years (1975-1983). He was appointed deputy chief of the Criminal Division in 1979 and deputy chief of the Special Prosecution Division in 1983, where he supervised all financial markets prosecutions and major official corruption cases.

Mr. Senderowitz has lectured at Villanova Law School and made presentations at various seminars on financial market litigation. In addition, he has lectured to the FBI Academy on derivatives fraud and official corruption prosecutions.
